20	1. Benjamin Bodea (Complainant) brings this Accusation solely in his official capacity			
21	as the Executive Officer of the Acupuncture Board, Department of Consumer Affairs.			
22	2. On or about October 2, 2006, the Acupuncture Board issued Acupuncture license			
23	Number 11253 to Ann Tung Cappa, L.Ac. (Respondent). The Acupuncture license was in full			
24	force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein and will expire on December			
25	31, 2021, unless renewed.			
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JURISDICTION 1 2 3. This Accusation is brought before the Acupuncture Board (Board), Department of Consumer Affairs, under the authority of the following laws. All section references are to the 3 Business and Professions Code (Code) unless otherwise indicated 4 4. Section 4955 of the Code states: 5 6 The board may deny, suspend, or revoke, or impose probationary conditions upon, the license of any acupuncturist who is guilty of unprofessional conduct. 7 Unprofessional conduct shall include, but not be limited to, the following: 8 9 (c) False or misleading advertising. 10 (d) Aiding or abetting in, or violating or conspiring in, directly or indirectly, the 11 violation of the terms of this chapter or any regulation adopted by the board pursuant to this chapter. 12 13 (i) The violation of any law or local ordinance on an acupuncturist's business 14 premises by an acupuncturist's employee or a person who is working under the acupuncturist's professional license or business permit, that is substantially related to 15 the qualifications, functions, or duties of an acupuncturist. These violations shall subject the acupuncturist who employed the individuals, or under whose 16 acupuncturist license the employee is working, to disciplinary action. 17 18 (1) the failure to notify the board of the use of any false, assumed, or fictitious name other than the name under which the licensee is licensed as an individual to 19 practice acupuncture. 5. Section 4927, of the Code states: 20 21 As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise requires: 22 23 (d) "Acupuncture" means the stimulation of a certain point or points on or near the 24 surface of the body by the insertion of needles to prevent or modify the perception of 25 pain or to normalize physiological functions, including pain control for the treatment of certain diseases or dysfunctions of the body and includes the techniques of 26 electroacupuncture, cupping, and moxibustion. 6. Section 4955.1 of the Code states: 27 28 The board may deny, suspend, revoke, or impose probationary conditions upon

the license of any acupuncturist if he or she is guilty of committing a fraudulent act 1 including, but not be limited to, any of the following: 2 3 (b) Committing a fraudulent or dishonest act as an acupuncturist. 4 7. Section 4961 of the Code states: 5 6 (a) Every person who is now or hereafter licensed to practice acupuncture in this state shall register, on forms prescribed by the Acupuncture Board, the licensee's 7 place of practice, or, if the licensee has more than one place of practice, all of the places of practice. If the licensee has no place of practice, the licensee shall notify the 8 board of that fact. A person licensed by the board shall register within 30 days after the date of his or her licensure. 9 (b) An acupuncturist licensee shall post his or her wall license in a conspicuous 10 location in his or her place of practice at all times. If an acupuncturist has more than one place of practice, he or she shall obtain from the board a duplicate wall license 11 for each additional location and post the duplicate wall license at each location. 12 (c) Any licensee that changes the location of his or her place of practice shall register each change within 30 days of making that change. In the event a licensee 13 fails to notify the board of any change in the address of a place of practice within the time prescribed by this section, the board may deny renewal of licensure. An 14 applicant for renewal of licensure shall specify in the application whether or not there has been a change in the location of the licensee's place of practice and, if so, the date 15 of that change. The board may accept that statement as evidence of the change of address. 16 8. Section 4975 of the Code states: 17 18 An acupuncture corporation is a corporation which is authorized to render professional services, as defined in Section 13401 of the Corporations Code, so long 19 as that corporation and its shareholders, officers, directors, and employees rendering professional services who are acupuncturists are in compliance with the Moscone-20 Knox Professional Corporation Act, this article and all other statutes and regulations now or hereafter enacted or adopted pertaining to that corporation and the conduct of 21 its affairs. 22 With respect to an acupuncture corporation, the governmental agency referred to in the Moscone-Knox Professional Corporation Act is the Acupuncture Board. 23 9. Section 4976 of the Code states: 24 25 It shall constitute unprofessional conduct and a violation of this chapter for any person licensed under this chapter to violate, attempt to violate, directly or indirectly, 26 or assist in or abet the violation of, or conspire to violate, any provision or term of this article, the Moscone-Knox Professional Corporation Act, or any regulations duly 27 adopted under those laws.

Section 119 of the Code states:

28	13. Section 4959 of the Code states:	

- 17. As of October 31, 2017, the business Golden Bay Health Center, LLC. looked the same as when the business was operating as Golden Bay Spa. The exterior of the business still had the Golden Bay Massage business name and only advertised massage services. The inside lobby only had advertisement for massage services with pricing displayed. There were no references or any indication that acupuncture services were offered at the location.
- 18. On November 21, 2017, Santa Clara County police officers conducted a massage business inspection/compliance check at Golden Bay Health Center, LLC. Prior to arriving at the business, officers conducted an internet search to determine if massage services were being advertised, as this is supposed to be an acupuncture establishment, and no longer a massage parlor. The officers did find advertisements posted on "backpage.com" on November 20, 2017, which provided the name of the business as Golden Bay Spa, phone number, address, and inappropriate photos of women in sexually suggestive poses. Upon arrival, officers were greeted by a massage therapist. The officers observed three California Massage Therapy Council certificates posted on the wall along with the acupuncture license of Respondent. The officers did not observe any acupuncture equipment or supplies. Respondent was not present. Officers issued an administrative citation to Shu Juan Li for five city ordinance violations: failure to post massage certificates, incomplete ledger, inappropriate advertising, linens not stored properly, and failure to register a massage therapist.
- 19. On January 29, 2018, online advertisements for Golden Bay Health Center, LLC on Craigslist showed an advertisement for acupuncture services and acceptance of PPO insurance.
- 20. On March 9, 2018, the Respondent was interviewed by the Board's investigator. Respondent stated she was currently unemployed but sees patients occasionally at 2234 Irving Street, San Francisco, CA, where she also teaches piano lessons. Respondent told the investigator that she was co-owner of the Golden Bay Health Center with Shu Juan Li and provided the business address as 1998 Homestead, but was unable to provide the phone number of the business. Respondent told the investigator that Li paid her \$550 per month to have Respondent's acupuncture license posted on the wall at Golden Bay Health Center. Respondent provided an

employment agreement dated March 2017, signed by Li and Respondent, stating the terms of the full-time employment agreement which included the \$550 per month for license fee and a \$25 per hour starting wage. The employment agreement also listed Respondent as the employee and Li as the employer, and Respondent would be the only acupuncturist for the company. Even though Respondent received the \$550 monthly payment, Respondent never practiced acupuncture at Golden Bay Health Center between March 2017 and March 2018.

- 21. On March 20, 2018, Golden Bay Health Center, LLC filed in the City of Santa Clara, a Renewal of Business Tax Affidavit, listing both Wenmei Xue and Ann Tung as owners and license type as acupuncture. Wenmei Xue is not a licensed acupuncturist.
- 22. On June 8, 2018, the Board's investigator took photos of the exterior of the Golden Bay Health Center, LLC. The business is still identified by signage as the Golden Bay Spa with only massage advertisements on the windows of the business.
- 23. On October 30, 2018, the Santa Clara Police Department conducted an undercover operation at Golden Health Center, LLC. An undercover officer went into Golden Health Center, LLC with a preplanned appointment for a massage. Wenmei Xue directed the undercover officer to undress. During the massage, Xue inappropriately touched the undercover officer's penis and offered sexual services for money. Shortly after the undercover officer left, police officers entered Golden Health Center, LLC to conduct a massage compliance check. Respondent was located in the front lobby. Three massage therapists were working at the time of inspection. One of the massage therapist was Wenmei Xue.
- 24. On October 24, 2018, a citizen filed a report with the Santa Clara Police Department regarding an encounter that occurred at the Golden Bay Health Center, LLC on October 23, 2018. The citizen paid cash for a massage. During the massage, the masseuse touched the citizen inappropriately on his testicles. The citizen reported the encounter on belief that prostitution was occurring at the business.
- 25. On January 3, 2019, Respondent was interviewed again by the Board's investigator. During the interview, Respondent informed the investigator Golden Bay Health Center, LLC closed in December 2018 due to infractions cited by the City of Santa Clara which included

sexual services offered at the business. Respondent also admitted she thought sexual services were being offered at the business.

Acuwonder, Inc.

- 26. On November 28, 2018, the Board's investigator visited 53 Cronin Drive, Santa Clara, CA where an online google search showed Acuwonder was listed as a business at the location.
- 27. Acuwonder, Inc. was formed on or about March 23, 2011 as an acupuncture and acupressure business. Jinyi Huang filed Articles of Incorporation as the Chief Executive Officer, with a business location at 1280 S. Abel St, Milpitas, CA 95035. On October 26, 2018, Aidan Xie, an Officer, signed an updated Statement of Information. Jinyi Huang and Aidan Xie are not licensed acupuncturist.
- 28. During the January 3, 2019 interview with the Board investigator, Respondent told the investigator that she worked at Acuwonder located at 265 Meridian Ave., San Jose, CA. Respondent disclosed she was paid by Acuwonder \$550 per month for the use of her acupuncture license, but she never saw any patients there. Respondent told the investigator the agreement was for Acuwonder to use her acupuncture license and that Respondent needed to physically be at the office "for when the city inspection happen."
- 29. On May 10, 2019, the Board investigator conducted an online search through the City of San Jose website for current business licenses at 265 Meridian Ave., Suite 9, San Jose, CA. The current business licensed at the address is Acuwonder, which is listed as an acupuncture business. The Board investigator went to the address location and was greeted by Aidan Xie. The investigator asked to speak to the acupuncturist. Xie pulled Respondent's acupuncturist certificate from a back shelf and presented it to the investigator. Also posted on the wall behind the back counter was a California Massage Therapy license for Xinfeng Bao. Bao was one of the massage therapist present at the police inspection at Golden Health Center, LLC on October 30, 2018.

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Shu Ling Health Center LP (formerly Shangrila Spa, LP)

- 30. On December 5, 2018, the Board investigator found Secretary of State records, listing Shui Ling Health Center LP as an acupuncture business, which listed Jie Len Chen as the owner and Respondent as the Agent for Service of Process. On April 21, 2014, Sui Zhou and Respondent became partners for Shangrila Spa, located at 131 E. Taylor Ave., San Jose, CA. On March 12, 2015, the name of Shangrila Spa, LP was changed to Shui Ling Health Center. Jie Lan Chen was added as General Partner. Sui Zhou was disassociated as a partner and Respondent was listed as the Agent of Service. On August 15, 2018, Shu Ling Health Center, LP was cancelled, signed by Jie Lan Chen. Sui Zhou and Jie Lan Chen are not licensed acupuncturist.
- 31. On the January 3, 2019 interview with the Board investigator, Respondent told the investigator that she became a partner to the business Shu Ling Health Center LP in 2014 with the owner named Jie Lan Chen, who Respondent believed to be a massage therapist. Chen paid Respondent \$550 per month to offer acupuncture. Respondent did not believe she had a wall certificate posted on the walls of the business. Respondent also provided a Limited Partnership Agreement, dated March 28, 2014, entered between Sui Zhou and Respondent, to provide professional services.
- 32. On February 8, 2019, the Board investigator visited Shui Ling Health Center LP at the listed address and found the building showed no business signage and the electric "open" sign was off. The address appeared to be a vacant address.

Other Practice Locations

33. On April 14, 2018, in an email to the Board, Respondent disclosed she practices at her office located at 2234 Irving Street, San Francisco and works actively with Jade Health and Wellness Facilities of Synergy and Fremont Orthopedic & Rehabilitative Medicine. She also works inactively² with Shuiling Health Center, Golden Bay Health Center, and a new office with Acuwonder. None of these offices and locations are registered with the Board as places of practice for Respondent.

² Respondent's email stating she works "inactively" refers to the three businesses that she allowed to post her acupuncture certificate in exchange for payment. She does not see patients at the three businesses.

FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Lends License and/or Permits Unlawful Use of a License and/or Fraudulent and Dishonest Act)

- 34. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under Code section 119(b) and/or 119(e), section 125, section 4955(d) and 4955.1(b) in that Respondent engaged in conduct described above, including, but not limited to, the following:
- a. Respondent registered Golden Bay Health Center, LLC as a purported acupuncture business, which was used as a massage parlor.
- b. Respondent allowed her California Acupuncture license to be used by Shu Yuan Li as a massage parlor and avoid oversight by the Santa Clara Police Department, violating multiple local ordinances, including offering sexual services.
- c. Respondent allowed her California Acupuncture license to be used by Acuwonder, Inc. knowing the intended purpose was to respond to city inspections, and not for acupuncture services.
- d. Respondent knowingly permitted the use of her license by others, and for unlawful purposes of presenting an establishment as an acupuncture clinic, when it was not.

SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Partnership and/or Employment Agreement with Unlicensed Individuals)

- 35. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1399.475, Code section 4975 and 4976 in that Respondent engaged in conduct described above, including, but not limited to, the following:
- a. Respondent entered into a partnership and/or employment agreement with Shu Juan Li, who is not a licensed acupuncturist, in the formation of Golden Bay Health Center, LLC.
- b. Respondent entered into ownership of Golden Bay Health Center, LLC with Wenmei Xue, who is not a licensed acupuncturist.
- c. Respondent entered into employment agreement with Jinyi Huang and/or Aidan Xie, both unlicensed acupuncturist, in her association and work at Acuwonder, Inc.

Respondent entered into partnership and employment agreement with Sui Zhou and/or Jie Lan Chen, both unlicensed acupuncturist, in her partnership and work at Shui Ling

THIRD CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(False Advertising and/or Committing a Fraudulent or Dishonest Act as an Acupuncturist)

- Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under Code section 4955(c), section 4955 (d), and 4955(j) in that Respondent engaged in conduct described above, including, but not
- Respondent advertised rented her California Acupuncture license to be used by Shu Yuan Li to register Golden Bay Health Center, LLC as a purported acupuncture business, which

FOURTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Failure to Notify Place of Practice)

- Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under Code section 4955(1) and 4961(a) in that Respondent engaged in the conduct described above, including, but not limited to, the
- Respondent failed to notify the Acupuncture Board of all the places of practice, including her office located at 2234 Irving Street, San Francisco, Jade Health and Wellness Facilities of Synergy, Fremont Orthopedic & Rehabilitative Medicine, Shuiling Health Center LP,
- Respondent failed to register with the Acupuncture Board all the places of practice, including her office located at 2234 Irving Street, San Francisco, Jade Health and Wellness Facilities of Synergy, Fremont Orthopedic & Rehabilitative Medicine, Shuiling Health Center LP,

WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged, and that following the hearing, the Acupuncture Board issue a decision:

1	1.	Revoking or suspending Acupuncture Number 11253, issued to Ann Tung Cappa,
2	L.Ac.;	
3	2.	Ordering Ann Tung Cappa, L.Ac. to pay the Acupuncture Board the reasonable costs
4	of the investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Business and Professions Code	
5	section 4959; and,	
6	3. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
