20	1. Benjamin Bodea (Complainant) brings	this Accusation solely in his official capacity
21	as the Executive Officer of the Acupuncture Board of California (Board).	
22	2. On September 29, 2014, the Board issu	ned Acupuncturist License Number AC 16228
23	to Su Chen Lee, L.Ac. (Respondent). That license was in full force and effect at all times	
24	relevant to the charges brought herein and will exp.	ire on March 31, 2024, unless renewed.
25	JURISDICTION	
26	3. This Accusation is brought before the Board under the authority of the following	
27	laws. All section references are to the Business and Professions Code (Code) unless otherwise	
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1	indicated.	
2	4. Section 4928.1 of the Code states:	
3	Protection of the public shall be the highest priority for the Acupuncture	
4	Board in exercising its licensing, regulatory, and disciplinary functions. Whenever the protection of the public is inconsistent with other interests sought to be promoted,	
5	the protection of the public shall be paramount.	
6	5. Section 4928 of the Code states:	
7	(a) The Acupuncture Board, which consists of seven members, shall enforce and administer this chapter.	
8		
9	(b) This section shall remain in effect only until January 1, 2023, and as of that date is repealed.	
10	(c) Notwithstanding any other law, the repeal of this section renders the board	
11	subject to review by the appropriate policy committees of the Legislature.	
12	6. Section 4955 of the Code states, in applicable part:	
13	The board may deny, suspend, or revoke, or impose probationary conditions upon, the license of any acupuncturist who is guilty of unprofessional conduct.	
14	Unprofessional conduct shall include, but not be limited to, the following:

22	7. Section 4955.1 of the Code states:	
23	The board may deny, suspend, revoke, or impose probationary conditions upon	
24	the license of any acupuncturist if he or she is guilty of committing a fraudulent act including, but not be limited to, any of the following:	
25	(a) Securing a license by fraud or deceit.	
26	(b) Committing a fraudulent or dishonest act as an acupuncturist.	
27	(c) Committing any act involving dishonesty or corruption with respect to the qualifications, functions, or duties of an acupuncturist.

graduated from a foreign educational institution. The application, signed by Respondent on April 11, 2014, attested under penalty of perjury to the facts asserted in the application.

- 12. The application included Respondent's claim that she attended and graduated from Fujian University of Traditional Chinese Medicine (Fujian) from September, 1975 to July, 1980. The application included an Evaluation Report from the Foundation of International Services, Inc. (FIS) confirming Respondent's attendance and graduation from Fujian.
- 13. The application included Respondent's Council of Colleges of Acupuncture and Oriental Medicine certificate which stated on September 26, 2009, Respondent passed the Clean Needle Technique Course [CNT].
- 14. The application included Respondent's claim she took a First Aid CPR class on May 3, 2013, thereafter passed the CPR test, and was issued her CPR certificate in May, 2015.
  - 15. Respondent took the August 19, 2014, examination and achieved a passing score.
- 16. Information that suggested Respondent secured her license by fraud arose in an unrelated investigation. Thereafter the Board requested an investigation of this information by the Division of Investigation of the Department of Consumer Affairs. The Board also undertook a comprehensive review of the validity of the documents Respondent provided in support of her application.
- 17. The investigation conducted by the Division of Investigation established that the Evaluation Report Respondent provided from FIS was fraudulent.
- 18. The Board's review included correspondence with the entity which purportedly taught the CNT class required by the Board for licensure. The Board's review revealed that Respondent fraudulently stated she took the CNT class and in fact had never attended the class.
- 19. The Board's review included correspondence with the entity which purportedly taught the CPR class required by the Board for licensure. The Board's review revealed that Respondent fraudulently stated she took the CPR class and in fact had never attended the class.
- 20. On March 4, 2020, the Division of Investigation investigator sent a certified letter to Respondent and requested she contact the investigator to schedule an interview regarding the investigation. The investigator did not receive a response to his letter.

1	21. Respondent has subjected her license to disciplinary action under Code sections 498	
2	and 4955.1, subdivision (a), in that she secured her license by fraudulently submitting false	
3	documents with her application.	
4	SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE	
5	(Dishonest and Corrupt Acts)	
6	22. The allegations of paragraphs 10 through 21, above are incorporated by reference as	
7	if set out in full. Respondent has subjected her license to disciplinary action for unprofessional	
8	conduct, in that her knowing presentation of fraudulent documents to obtain her acupuncture	
9	license was both dishonest and corrupt, and a violation of the statutes administered and enforced	
10	by the Acupuncture Board (Chapter 12, Division 2 of the Code), in violation of Code section	
11	4955, subdivisions (d) and (i).	
12	PRAYER	
13	WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged,	
14	and that following the hearing, the Acupuncture Board issue a decision:	
15	1. Revoking or suspending Acupuncturist License Number AC 16228, issued to Su	
16	Chen Lee, L.Ac.;	
17	2. Ordering her to pay the Acupuncture Board the reasonable costs of the investigation	
18	and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 4959;	
19	3. If placed on probation, ordering her to pay the Acupuncture Board the costs of	
20	probation monitoring and,	
21	4. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
