COST RECOVERY

- 6. Section 4959 of the Code states:
- "(a) The board may request the administrative law judge, under his or her proposed decision in resolution of a disciplinary proceeding before the board, to direct any licensee found guilty of unprofessional conduct to pay to the board a sum not to exceed actual and reasonable costs of the investigation and prosecution of the case.
- "(b) The costs to be assessed shall be fixed by the administrative law judge and shall not in any event be increased by the board. When the board does not adopt a proposed decision and remands the case to an administrative law judge, the administrative law judge shall not increase the amount of any costs assessed in the proposed decision.
- "(c) When the payment directed in the board's order for payment of costs is not made by the licensee, the board may enforce the order for payment in the superior court in the county where the administrative hearing was held. This right of enforcement shall be in addition to any other rights the board may have as to any licensee directed to pay costs.
- "(d) In any judicial action for the recovery of costs, proof of the board's decision shall be conclusive proof of the validity of the order of payment and the terms for payment.
- "(e) All costs recovered under this section shall be considered a reimbursement for costs incurred and shall be deposited in the Acupuncture Fund."

FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS

- 7. On or about September 27, 2019, Respondent was arrested by agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation.
 - 8. Respondent failed to inform the Board of this arrest.
- 9. On November 6, 2019, the United States Attorney's Office, United States Department of Justice, filed an information against Respondent, alleging that Respondent violated 18 U.S.C.

section 951 – Acting as an Agent of a Foreign Government Without Notice to the Attorney General.

- 10. Specifically, the information accused Respondent of providing, on at least four occasions, classified information related to the security of the United States of America to agents of the Ministry of State Security (MSS) of the People's Republic of China, without authorization from the government of the United States of America. These actions are alleged to have occurred between June 13, 2015, and July 2, 2018.
- 11. Respondent failed to inform the Board that the information had been filed against him.
- 12. On March 17, 2020, Respondent was convicted in the United States District Court, Northern District of California, Case No. CR19-00589-001 HSG, of violating 18 U.S.C section 951, Acting as a Foreign Agent Without Notification, a felony.

CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Unprofessional Conduct)

13. Respondent's license is subject to disciplinary action under Code sections 4955 (b), (d) and (i), and California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1399.469.2 (d) in that Respondent was convicted of a felony; acted in a manner that would have warranted the denial of his acupuncture license; was arrested by the Federal Bureau of Investigations and failed to inform the Board of the arrest; and never informed the Board that the United States Attorney's Office filed an information alleging that Respondent committed a felony.

<u>PRAYER</u>

WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged, and that following the hearing, the Acupuncture Board issue a decision:

- Revoking or suspending Acupuncturist License Number AC 9392, issued to Xue Hua
 Peng, L.Ac.;
- 2. Ordering Xue Hua Peng, L.Ac. to pay the Acupuncture Board the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 4959; and,
