IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that:

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Defendant Thomas Charles Flach, Jr., holder of Acupuncture License No. AC 11773,
 is prohibited from treating or seeing female patients and minor patients, as an acupuncturist. This
 paragraph goes into effect immediately.

Defendant shall maintain a log of all patients seen or treated by him. The log shall 5 2. contain: (1) the patient's name, sex, address, and phone number; and (2)-patient's medical record 6 number.- Defendant shall keep this log in a separate file or ledger, in chronological order, shall 7 make the log available for immediate inspection and copying at all times during business hours by 8 the Acupuncture Board of California or their designees, and shall retain the log for the entire term 9 of this Order. Defendant has 48 hours after 1:45 p.m. on Wednesday, October 3, 2018, to inform 10 and educate his clinical staff of his requirements under this paragraph, put in place necessary 11 arrangements and systems for keeping this particular log, at his clinic, up-and-running by 1:45 12 p.m. on Friday, October 5, 2018. This log shall be available for immediate inspection and 13 copying at all times during business hours by the Acupuncture Board of California or their 14 designees starting at 1:45 p.m. on Friday, October 5, 2018, and Defendant shall retain the log at 15 his clinic for the entire term of this Order. 16

Defendant's existing female patients may be seen or treated by a California-licensed 17 3. acupuncturist, other than the Defendant, that works at Defendant's clinic, barring any current or 18 prior license restrictions imposed or pending against the acupuncturist. However, at no time, 19 shall Defendant be allowed to be in the same room as female patients. This acupuncturist, other 20than the Defendant, ("Assisting Acupuncturist") who may provide acupuncture services to the 21 existing female patients at Defendant's clinic must be vetted and approved by the Acupuncture 22 Board prior to commencing work at the Defendant's clinic. No later than two (2) weeks prior to 23 his/her commencement of work as an acupuncturist at the Defendant's clinic, Defendant shall 24 provide the name and the Acupuncturist License number of the Assisting Acupuncturist to the 25 Acupuncture Board, so it can verify the current standing of his/her license and to ensure that 26 he/she does not have any prior discipline or restriction imposed on or any pending action against 27 his/her license. Prior to his/her commencement of working at the Defendant's clinic, the 28

All female patients that enter Defendant's clinic will be orally notified by a staff 4. 4 member other than Defendant that Defendant is "prohibited from treating female patients until 5 further notice." This paragraph goes into effect immediately. All female patients that enter 6 Defendant's clinic on October 3, 2018, October 4, 2018, and prior to 1:45 p.m. on October 5, 7 2018, will be orally notified by a staff member other than Defendant that Defendant is "prohibited 8 from treating female patients until further notice," and again at their next entry into the 9 Defendant's clinic after 1:45 p.m. on October 5, 2018, at which time the latter oral notification 10 will be recorded in the log referenced under Paragraph 5. 11

12 5. Defendant shall also maintain a separate log of all female patients seen or treated at his clinic and to whom the required oral notification was made. The log shall contain: (1) the 13 patient's name, address, and phone number; (2) patient's medical-record number; (3) the full 14 name of the person making the oral notification; (4) the date the notification was made; and (5) a 15 description of the notification given. California. Defendant's Acupuncture License No. AC 11773 was issued to him on March 30, 5 2007, and will expire on April 30, 2019, unless renewed. He is represented in this proceeding by 6 7 Virginia Blumenthal, Esq. and Jehan Jayakumar, Esq. 8 The Acupuncture Board is the state agency charged with protecting the public 2. through the licensing and discipline of acupuncturists in the State of California. The Acupuncture 9 Board is represented in the above-entitled matter by Xavier Becerra, Attorney General of the 10 11 State of California, by Deputy Attorney General Michael J. Yun. 12 On or about June 29, 2018, in Case No. MSB18010925 of the Superior Court of 3. 13 California, County of San Bernardino, the San Bernardino County District Attorney's Office filed a criminal complaint, entitled The People of the State of California v. Thomas Charles Flach, Jr., 14 charging Defendant with one count of a misdemeanor violation of Penal Code section 243.4, 15 16 subdivision (e), subsection (1) [Sexual Battery] against JANE DOE. Pursuant to Penal Code sections 1204.5, 1275, and 23, the Acupuncture Board, a state 17 4. agency, voluntarily and lawfully appeared in this criminal proceeding to make a recommendation 18 to the Court to promote the interests of justice and to protect the interests of the public because 19 the crime charged is substantially related to the qualifications, functions or duties of the licensee. 20Pursuant to these statutory provisions, the Acupuncture Board submitted a Notice of Appearance 21 and Recommendation by the Acupuncture Board of California seeking to prohibit Defendant's 22 practice of acupuncture as a condition of bail, a condition of own recognizance release, or a 23 condition of probation. 24 25 The parties, through their respective attorneys, have agreed to the issuance of the 5. appended Order by this Court regarding the restriction of Defendant's practice of acupuncture, 26 and Defendant hereby agrees that he shall be prohibited from treating or seeing female patients 2728 111
