19	1. Terri Thorfinnson (Complainant) brings this Accusation solely in her official capacity		
20	as the Executive Officer of the Acupuncture Board, Department of Consumer Affairs.		
21	2. On or about November 3, 2014, the Acupuncture Board issued Acupuncturist License		
22	Number AC 16366 to Justin R. Bovert, AC (Respondent). The Acupuncturist License was in full		
23	force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein and will expire on March 31,		
24	2016, unless renewed.		
25	JURISDICTION		
26	3. This Accusation is brought before the Acupuncture Board (Board), Department of		
27	Consumer Affairs, under the authority of the following laws. All section references are to the		
28	Business and Professions Code unless otherwise indicated.

27 28 4. Section 4955 of the Code states:

"The board may deny, suspend, or revoke, or impose probationary conditions upon, the license of any acupuncturist if he or she is guilty of unprofessional conduct.

"Unprofessional conduct shall include, but not be limited to, the following:

- "(a) Using or possessing any controlled substance as defined in Division 10 (commencing with Section 11000) of the Health and Safety Code, or dangerous drug or alcoholic beverage to an extent or in a manner dangerous to himself or herself, or to any other person, or to the public, and to an extent that the use impairs his or her ability to engage in the practice of acupuncture with safety to the public.
- "(b) Conviction of a crime substantially related to the qualifications, functions, or duties of an acupuncturist, the record of conviction being conclusive evidence thereof."
- Section 4956 of the Code states:

"A plea or verdict of guilty or a conviction following a plea of nolo contendere made to a charge which is substantially related to the qualifications, functions, or duties of an acupuncturist is deemed to be a conviction within the meaning of this chapter.

"The board may order a license suspended or revoked, or may deny a license, or may impose probationary conditions upon a license, when the time for appeal has elapsed, or the judgment of conviction has been affirmed on appeal, or when an order granting probation is made suspending the imposition of sentence irrespective of a subsequent order under the provisions of Section 1203.4 of the Penal Code allowing the person to withdraw his or her pleas of guilty and to enter a plea of not guilty, or setting aside the verdict of guilty, or dismissing the accusation, complaint, information, or indictment."

6. Section 125.3 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that the Board may request the administrative law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation or violations of the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case, with failure of the licentiate to comply subjecting the license to not being

DISCIPLINE CONSIDERATIONS

- 13. To determine the degree of discipline, if any, to be imposed on Respondent, Complainant alleges that on or about November 28, 2000, in a prior criminal proceeding entitled *People v. Justin Ronald Bovert* in Humboldt County Superior Court, Case Number CR005125S, Respondent was convicted for violating VC 23153(a), (DUI with Bodily Injury), a misdemeanor, and was ordered to be placed on three years of probation, and have his driving privilege suspended for one year. Respondent was required to complete twenty hours of community service, complete a three-month alcohol program, and pay the victims restitution. The record of the criminal proceeding is incorporated as if fully set forth.
- 14. The underlying facts of the conviction are that on or about November 2, 2000, at approximately 1:45 a.m., Respondent was driving a Geo Storm at 35 mph on Sutter Road in Arcata, California, when he crashed into a parked truck. Respondent's passenger hit her head on the dashboard upon impact. Respondent then left the scene of the accident in order to drive his passenger to her sister's house for the sister to take his passenger to the hospital. Respondent failed to called the police at the scene of the accident but did subsequently contact the police at a later time that day.

PRAYER

WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged, and that following the hearing, the Acupuncture Board issue a decision:

- Revoking or suspending Acupuncturist License Number AC 16366, issued to Justin R. Bovert, AC
- 2. Ordering Justin R. Bovert, AC to pay the Acupuncture Board the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 4959;
