On April 7, 2014, the Board received an application for examination from Respondent, the necessary precursor to granting an acupuncture license to an applicant who 3 graduated from a foreign educational institution. The application signed by Respondent on April 4 5 7, 2014, attested under penalty of perjury to the facts asserted in the application. 12. During the application process, Respondent submitted a Clean Needle Technique 6 [CNT] Course certificate from the Council of Colleges of Acupuncture and Oriental Medicine, as 7 8 well as an Evaluation Report from the Foundation of International Services, Inc. (FIS) to the 9 Board, and information regarding her employment history. 10 13. On or about and between August 19, 2014, Respondent took the Examination and achieved a passing score. Based on the representations in Respondent's application, the Board 11 issued Acupuncturist License Number AC 16367 to Dong Qing Lu on November 3, 2014. 12 14. During the Board's investigation of another acupuncturist, the Board received 13 14 information regarding an allegation of fraud in obtaining the acupuncturist's license against Respondent. Thereafter, the Board requested an investigation of the matter by the Division of 15 Investigation of the Department of Consumer Affairs and undertook a comprehensive review of 16 the validity of the documents Respondent provided in support of her application. 17 The investigation conducted by the Division of Investigation established that 15. 18 19 Respondent's CNT certificate was fraudulent. 16. The investigation conducted by the Division of Investigation established that the 20 Evaluation Report from FIS was fraudulent. 21 17. The investigation conducted by the Division of Investigation established that the 22 employment history Respondent provided to the Board was fraudulent. 23 24 18. The Division of Investigation investigator attempted to schedule a Subject Interview with the Respondent. The investigator sent a request to the Respondent by certified mail, which 25 asked the Respondent to supply the investigator with a date for the Subject Interview. The 26 Respondent failed to respond to the Investigator's request. 27 Respondent has subjected her license to disciplinary action under Code sections 498 19. 28
