19	1. Terri Thorfinnson ("Complainant") brings this Accusation solely in her official	
20	capacity as the Executive Officer of the Acupuncture Board, Department of Consumer Affairs	
21	("Board").	
22	2. On or about July 3, 2002, the Board issued Acupuncturist's License Number AC 8509	
23	to Karen Gao ("Respondent"). The Acupuncturist's License was in full force and effect at all	
. 24	times relevant to the charges brought herein and will expire on October 31, 2015, unless renewed.	
• 25	JURISDICTION	
26	3. This Accusation is brought before the Board under the authority of the following	
	laws. All section references are to the Business and Professions Code ("Code") unless otherwise	
28	indicated.	1 Accusation

1	4. Section 4955, subdivision (d) of the Code states:	
2	"The board may deny, suspend, or revoke, or impose probationary conditions upon, the	
3	license of any acupuncturist if he or she is guilty of unprofessional conduct.	
4	"Unprofessional conduct shall include, but not be limited to, the following:	
5	"(d) Aiding or abetting in, or violating or conspiring in, directly or indirectly, the	
6	violation of the terms of this chapter or any regulation adopted by the board pursuant to this	
7	chapter."	
8	5. Section 4955.1, subdivision (e) of the Code states:	
9	"The board may deny, suspend, revoke, or impose probationary conditions upon the license	
10	of any acupuncturist if he or she is guilty of committing a fraudulent act including, but not be	
11	limited to, any of the following:	·
12	"(e) Failing to maintain adequate and accurate records relating to the provision of	
13	services to their patients."	
14	6. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1399.453, states:	
15	"An acupuncturist shall keep complete and accurate records on each patient who is given	
16	acupuncture treatment, including but not limited to, treatments given and progress made as a	
17	result of the acupuncture treatments"	
18	7. Section 726 of the Code states:	
19	"The commission of any act of sexual abuse, misconduct, or relations with a patient, client,	
20	or customer constitutes unprofessional conduct and grounds for disciplinary action for any person	
21	licensed under this division, under any initiative act referred to in this division and under Chapter	
22	17 (commencing with Section 9000) of Division 3.	
23	"This section shall not apply to sexual contact between a physician and surgeon and his or	
24	her spouse or person in an equivalent domestic relationship when that physician and surgeon	
25	provides medical treatment, other than psychotherapeutic treatment, to his or her spouse or person

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RECOVERY OF COSTS 1 Section 4959 of the Code states: 8. 2 3 "(a) The board may request the administrative law judge, under his or her proposed decision in resolution of a disciplinary proceeding before the board, to direct any licensee 4 found guilty of unprofessional conduct to pay to the board a sum not to exceed actual and 5 reasonable costs of the investigation and prosecution of the case. 6 "(b) The costs to be assessed shall be fixed by the administrative law judge and shall 7 not in any event be increased by the board. When the board does not adopt a proposed 8 9 decision and remands the case to an administrative law judge, the administrative law judge shall not increase the amount of any costs assessed in the proposed decision. 10 "(c) When the payment directed in the board's order for payment of costs is not made 11 12 by the licensee, the board may enforce the order for payment in the superior court in the county where the administrative hearing was held. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under Code section 4955, subdivision (d) 21 and 726 in that she had sexual relations with a patient. The circumstances are as follows: 22 From approximately December 11, 2009 to May 15, 2010, Respondent provided 23 10. acupuncture treatment to Patient P.M.¹ Patient P.M. sought treatment to stop smoking and 24 alleviate stress. 25 11. 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1	sexual relationship with Patient P.M. During that time period, Respondent engaged in sexual
2	acts, including but not limited to sexual intercourse, after treatment with Patient P.M. in her office
3	on multiple occasions.
4	SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE
5	(Failure to Keep Adequate and Accurate Records)
6	12. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under section 4955.1, subdivision (e) of
7	the Code and California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1399.453 in that she failed to keep
8	complete and accurate records regarding her provision of acupuncture services to Patient P.M.
9	The circumstances are as follows:
10	13. The facts and allegations in Paragraphs 10 through 11, above, are incorporated by
11	reference and re-alleged as if fully set forth herein.
12	14. Respondent entered treatment notes in Patient P.M.'s medical records for treatment
13	that he received on May 1, 2010 and May 15, 2010. She did not chart treatment that she provided
14	to him on other dates, including but not limited to December 11, 2009, December 24, 2009, and
15	February 3, 2010. Credit card transactions for Patient P.M.'s treatment were processed to her
16	place of business, Euphora Acupuncture, on December 11, 2009, December 24, 2009, and
17	February 3, 2010.
18	15. In addition, Respondent failed to document a chronological account of Patient P.M.'s
19	medical history and illnesses. She did not collect, analyze, and document the clinical symptoms
20	and signs via the four diagnostic methods (a.k.a. the Four Examinations). And she did not
21	document subjective patient reporting, objective findings, diagnosis, prognosis, or a treatment
22	plan.
23	THIRD CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE
24	(Violation of Acupuncture Licensure Act or Regulation)
25	16. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under Code section 4955, subdivision (d)
26	in that she violated the terms of the Acupuncture Licensure Act, or a regulation adopted by the
27	Board pursuant to the Acupuncture Licensure Act. The circumstances are as follows:
28	17. The facts and allegations in Paragraphs 10 through 11 and 14 through 15, above, are 4 Accusation

2	FOURTH ÇAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE			
3	(Unprofessional Conduct)			
4	18. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under Code section 4955, subdivision (d)			
5	in that she engaged in unprofessional conduct by breaching the rules or ethical code of conduct of			
6	the profession of acupuncture, or by engaging in conduct unbecoming to an acupuncturist in good			
7	standing in the profession and which demonstrates an unfitness to practice acupuncture. ² The			
8	circumstances are as follows:			
9	19. The facts and allegations in Paragraphs 10 through 11 and 14 through 15, above, are			
10	incorporated by reference and re-alleged as if fully set forth herein.			
11	PRAYER			
12	WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged,			
13	and that following the hearing, the Board issue a decision:			
14	1. Revoking or suspending Acupuncturist's License Number AC 8509, issued to			
15	Respondent;			
16	2. Ordering Respondent to pay the Acupuncture Board the reasonable costs of the			
17	investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to section 4959 of the Code;			
18	3. Ordering Respondent, if placed on probation, to pay the Acupuncture Board the costs			
19	of probation monitoring; and			
20	4. Taking such other and further action as the Board deems necessary and proper.
